Letter from Rev Canon Tricia Rogers Priest in Charge with the Beacon Team

Dear Friends

I don't believe God ever intended us to be hermits – to be completely cut off from other people and isolated. You only have to go to the beginning of the book of Genesis to read 'it is not good for man to be alone' and Adam was given Eve as a companion. We all need people we can go to, to talk with, to share concerns and intimacies with and to get advice from. We all need friends.

At the end of this month – on the 30th July there is World Friendship Day. An idea initially proposed in1958 but not taking off till 2011 when this date was declared International Day of Friendship by the united assembly of the United Nations. With the idea that friendship between peoples, countries, cultures and individuals can inspire peace efforts and build bridges between communities.

Friends are very important in our lives. As my eldest daughter said to me once, "we choose our friends, but we have no choice with our families". In a sense, friends are chosen family; they have been chosen deliberately, they cheer us on through difficult times, and celebrate with us on joyful occasions. Life's special moments are made brighter by the presence of our close friends.

Friends prevent isolation and loneliness and give you a chance to offer much needed companionship, too. Friends can also: Increase your sense of belonging and purpose. Boost your happiness and reduce your stress. And apparently people live longer if they have a close friendship network.

I know people who say that they have over 500 friends on facebook, but this is not the friendship that is talked about in the Bible. Look closely and you will see Jesus gathered around him a small group of close friends who he could trust and share the important things of life with

Quality counts more than quantity. And while it is good to have a wide network of acquaintances it is the close, meaningful relationships that will support you through thick and thin.

Churches are good places for making and growing friendships, after all the Bible talks about us seeing the love shared between friends in a church, saying that this is how we will be known as Jesus' disciples Churches don't just meet on a Sunday but have lots of social gatherings midweek too.

Maybe 'World Friendship Day' is a good time to think about making some new friends or meeting up with old ones. Why don't you look in our parish magazines to see if there is a social gathering you could join in with this month to make and meet some friends, or come and join with us in the Beacon Team at our Joint Service at Selside – you will be made very welcome.

Friendship is something to cherish - cultivate it carefully.



Totters and Bumps and Babies

Totters

A very lively popular and friendly group which attracts between 40-50 toddlers plus adults every Monday 9 - 11am. It runs in term time only. The group is run primarily by a team of 5 volunteers. We provide support for the adults as well as activities for the children. Drinks for adults included in the fee. There are plenty of toys (large

and small), sit and ride toys, art and crafts, tuff tray messy activities, play dough, sand and sometimes a bouncy castle etc. We also have a quieter room for adults and children who find the other rooms too noisy and busy. The session ends with a healthy snack and a singing time.



Cornerstone Bumps and Babies (CBBs)

This small and friendly group runs in term time only on a Monday afternoon from 1.30 - 3pm. It is run by 2 volunteers. We have between 6 - 14 babies from birth to 1 year old plus adults attend on a regular basis. We offer friendship, advice and support to the adults. This is a safe place to come and experience the highs and lows of being a new parent. We attract mums, couples, dads and grandparents (and particularly when mum returns to work) We have play mats, rugs etc for the tiny babies and good quality, safe and stimulating toys and a ball pool for the babies to play with as they begin to sit up, move and eventually walk. There is opportunity to weigh the babies as well. Included in the low price is a choice of hot and cold drinks and a selection of lovely homemade cakes or biscuits.


when the fruit they have been named is called. Especially
