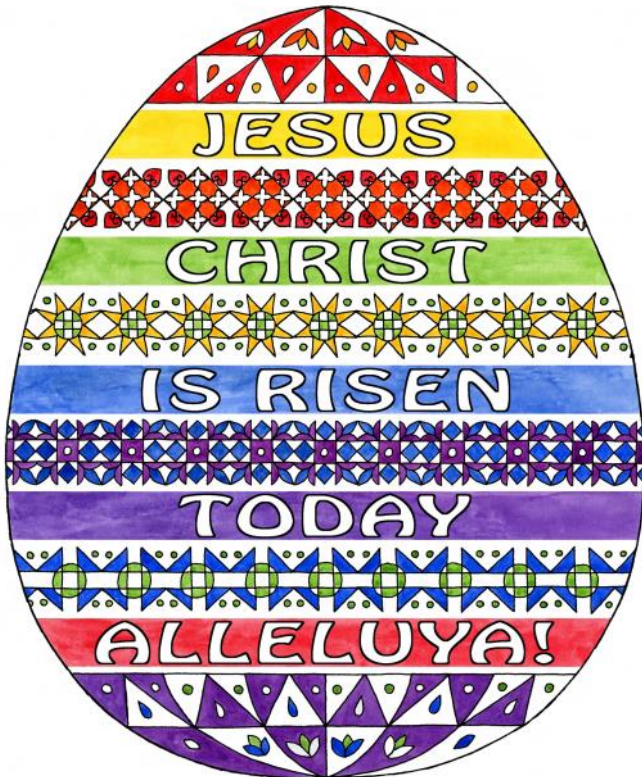

Letter from Rev Michelle Woodcock
Priest-in-Charge of the Beacon Team Churches

Dear Friends,

What sorts of things do you hope for?

I find myself hoping for all sorts of things during the course of each week, some more mundane than others, ranging from a lovely hot cuppa to thinking about a future travel adventure or quality time spent with family and friends. Of course, there are many other things that I hope for and often pray about including an end to war, famine, disease, poverty, and for a fairer sharing of the world's resources.

It's hard to have hope sometimes. Hope is easy enough when things are going well and life is enjoyable, but it's harder to find hope in the dark places, the times when suffering and pain are near to us in one way or another. I wonder how Jesus' family and followers must have felt on that first Holy Saturday. The day before, they had watched their friend and loved one die painfully at the hands of the Romans. What was happening? He was supposed to be the hope for all the world – the one who would rescue the world. How could he have failed so badly? Was it all to end like this? That must have been a very dark, hope-less day.

God's ways are so much bigger than our ways and so it shouldn't surprise us that this was all part of the plan. Jesus, fully human and yet fully God died on the cross in order that our relationship with God might be restored, that we might have the hope of eternal life with him. What a different day that first Easter Day must have been...shouts of "*He is not here, He has risen...*" echoing around the gardens and the joy and delight of Jesus' followers as they realised that there was hope and that it was much bigger and better than they could have imagined.

My prayer this month is that you may know something of the joy and hope of Easter in your daily life, especially during those times when hope seems far away.

Beacon Team Lent Course "Christ has no body now but yours"

There is still time to join us as we reflect on two key prayers. "Christ has no body but yours" attributed to St. Teresa of Avilla; and "God be in my Head". These two prayers build on the central theme of the Church - us - as the Body of Christ. We are exploring something of the characteristics of God and of the invitation to follow and work with God each day.

We meet at Skelsmergh Vicarage from 7-8.30pm on Wednesdays: 2nd April, 9th April and the course will end with a shared meal on 16th April.

Our February meeting began with Rev Jean enrolling Helen Atkinson and Kate Tadross, during which we all sang the Mothers Union hymn. Helen and Kate both received a badge and enrollment card.

The speaker was Tracy, who is the Client Supervisor at Age UK. Tracy told us that Age UK South Lakes and Barrow is a local charity in its own right, with its own board members and funding; it has been established for forty years and has an excellent reputation. Charity shops are a big support, providing 71% of its income. There are some paid members of staff. Grants are becoming less available.

Social groups include exercise classes, Men in Sheds, walking football and lunch groups. Everyone is welcome and some of our members have accessed the activities.

A helpline is available. Referrals can be made by GP's, friends and family with the person's consent. Contact could be just a general conversation, dealt with at the Helpline stage. A Case Officer can complete an assessment and signpost to other agencies, making a client aware of support available. There is a befriending service – a volunteer may meet up with a client once a fortnight. The Case Officer can also help with financial information and assist in completing assessment forms for financial help such as Carers Allowance (which is not means tested). They could also help with completing forms to grant Power of Attorney; Tracy stressed that this is not the same as a Will. Energy bills are a concern for many people and advice can be given about making the home more efficient. The aim is to provide information so that a client can make an informed choice.

Age UK advises clients of the broader help available and signposts to other organisations. The service is free and confidential, usually short term, around 2 months maximum but clients may access the service again in the future.

Tracy had brought in a selection of leaflets for anyone who wished to take them. Members thanked her for a highly informative and useful talk.

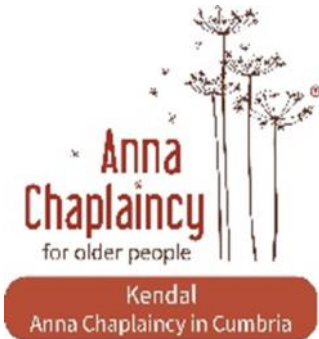

Totters and Bumps and Babies

Totters

A very lively popular and friendly group which attracts between 40-50 toddlers plus adults every **Monday 9 - 11am**. It runs in *term time* only. The group is run primarily by a team of 5 volunteers. We provide support for the adults as well as activities for the children. Drinks for adults included in the fee. There are plenty of toys (large and small), sit and ride toys, art and crafts, tuff tray messy activities, play dough, sand and sometimes a bouncy castle etc. We also have a quieter room for adults and children who find the other rooms too noisy and busy. The session ends with a healthy snack and a singing time.



Cornerstone Bumps and Babies (CBBs)

This small and friendly group runs in *term time only* on a Monday afternoon from 1.30 - 3pm. It is run by 2 volunteers. We have between 6 - 14 babies from birth to 1 year old plus adults attend on a regular basis. We offer friendship, advice and support to the adults. This is a safe place to come and experience the highs and lows of being a new parent. We attract mums, couples, dads and grandparents (particularly when mum returns to work). We have play mats, rugs etc for the tiny babies and good quality, safe and stimulating toys and a ball pool for the babies to play with as they begin to sit up, move and eventually walk. There is opportunity to weigh the babies as well. Included in the low price is a choice of hot and cold drinks and a selection of lovely homemade cakes or biscuits.

Grayrigg Rainfall

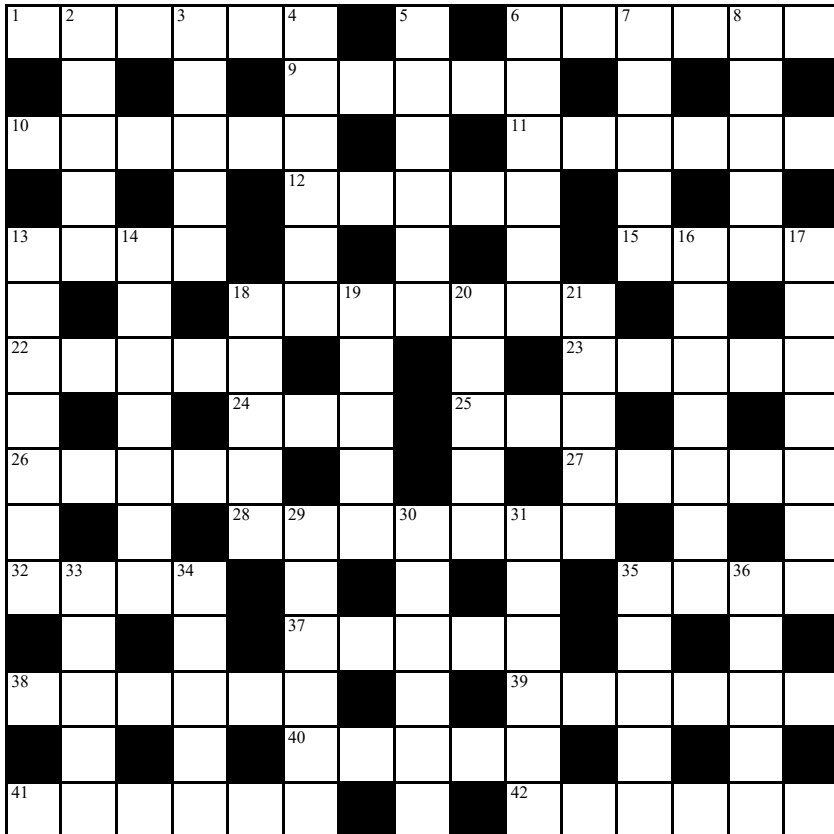
The rainfall in February 2025 was 64.5mm or 2.54 inches

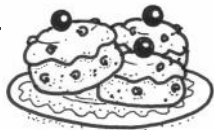
