Talking to Children about Mental Health – the challenges facing Gen Z and Gen Alpha By Lily-Jo, SPCK, £10.99

This practical guide aims to help adults understand the unique mental health challenges facing our children, teenagers and students today.

From the rise of AI personal technology to the ability to connect to your loved ones wherever you are, you'd think that we're advancing as a society. But for our young people's mental health, such progress has come at a cost.

The book examines the key mental health problems impacting young people today (such as depression, loneliness and anxiety) and explains how the lifestyle, culture and world they are living in has a significant mental health impact.

Suitable for parents, grandparents, teachers, youth workers and anyone in a position of care or interested in the future of mental health, this book offers resources to support the next generation.

Hope in the Face of Suffering – 20 devotions for Tough Times By Jeremy Marshall, 10 Publishing, £3.99

The pandemic has made all of us wake up to the reality of suffering and death. Do we each have a philosophy of life that copes with death?

Thankfully Jeremy Marshall helps us get the roof on before the storm hits. As he has lived with an incurable cancer diagnosis for five years, so he has the credentials to walk us through the Bible's story of hope, which wonderfully assures us that for the believer, death is never the last thing.

Letter from Rev. Canon Patricia Rogers

Beacon Mission Community

Have you always thought of a Church as the old building in your village or town, where people gather every Sunday for worship? We do refer these days to the bricks and mortar as the Church, but actually the Church is the people, and they don't have to be meeting together in a 'Church' building.

As the Beacon Mission Community we need to be thinking of new ways to gather together as Church, in places where people are already coming together to share their other interests. We need to be open to new ways of being God's Church and not be afraid to try things out

I read an article that pointed out that 'the church, like any other institution, is perennially susceptible to a 'hardening of the arteries.' In other words, we need to be careful of simply saying we have to hold on to the way church has always been done, because we may shrivel up and become sick.

Such a letting go doesn't mean, jettisoning our traditions, liturgies or structures. It means looking for additional ways of making the love of God relevant to the people in our communities.

It might help to remind ourselves that God is not inward looking, and that we need to be practising that principle too. Asking ourselves what is it that our community needs?

In Bristol one parish church Bristol realised that with all the teenage boys that lived there, it could do with a neighbourhood football team. Members of the congregation started it and gave lifts to the lads on a Saturday morning so that they could get to the football pitch.



















They listened to their problems and where appropriate prayed with them. The boys soon became more than a football team. They met together in an evening for pizza and discussion about the Christian faith. They started to learn about God together, to pray together and importantly they continued to play football on a Saturday morning.

They were a new way of being Church, yet they didn't actually go inside the Church building. It didn't make them any less of a Church for that. As a new year dawns, we need to think differently about who we are, how we do things and most importantly to be open to looking at what God wants us to do.



The early Romans used 1st March as New Years Day

England did not adopt 1st January as New Years Day until 1752 more than 150 years after Scotland. Before the year began on 25th March .the Feast of Annunciation.

Ethiopia wont celebrate New Year until 25th September . The country has stuck to the old Julian Calender, which fails to reflect the true length of the year.

"Auld Lang Syne " is traditionally sung at midnight on New Years Eve . It was written by Robert Burns .The words Auld Lang Syne means "times gone by"

In Italy people wear red underwear on New Year's Day to bring good Luck all year long.

The island nation Kiribati in the Central Pacific is the first location to ring in the New Year each year .

If you don't want to be bothered starting a new calendar or diary today, you can dig out one for 2007 and re-use it. Days of the week are the same.
