

## From the Associate Priest

Dear Friends,

#### UKRAINE



Just when we think things couldn't get any worse in Ukraine, they do! We are appalled at the atrocities we learn about in our newspapers and on our television screens and radios. We continue to pray for the people of Ukraine - and for peace. Maybe all of us have already

contributed financially to various agencies and hopefully we will continue to do that. Sometimes, though, it can be hard to know to which agency to donate. You may be interested to read of the emergency appeal launched by the Diocese in Europe and the USPG further on in this magazine - and details of how to support this appeal..

#### ASCENSION DAY

When I was at school - more years ago than I care to remember - we always had a day off on Ascension Day so that we could all go to Church on this important Christian festival. Sadly today, although Ascension Day will still be celebrated, for many people it will pass by unnoticed. So what is it all about, and why is it important? The Bible tells us that after Jesus' resurrection on Easter Day he was present on earth for forty more days, appearing at various times to his disciples. On the fortieth day - a Thursday - Jesus met with his disciples on the top of a mountain, and it was from there, we read in the first chapter of Acts in the Bible, that he was taken up to heaven, returning to his Father. The disciples were told that one day Jesus will return. But what happens in the meantime?

## Sitting at God's right hand

We read that Jesus occupies a position of power and authority at the centre of the universe, 'exalted to the right hand of God' (Acts 2:33). This position was secured by His death and resurrection, enabling us to experience the life of heaven, including eternal life, forgiveness, healing and the power to transform lives and communities. Is this our expectation and experience?

## Standing at God's right hand

Our experience of heaven is only partial because of the presence of suffering and disappointment in our lives. Stephen, the first Christian martyr, saw Jesus 'standing at the right hand of God' (Acts 7:56), when being stoned to death. Do we see that Jesus is on the throne and has a purpose for our lives, even when we are going through setbacks and difficulties? As a result of Stephen's death, the church grew and the apostle Paul was impacted. Where do we see the fruit of the suffering in our lives?

## Praying at God's right hand

Finally, we are told that Jesus is 'interceding for us' at God's right hand (Romans 8:34 & Hebrews 7:25). Jesus is on our side at the heart of the universe and fully knows our needs when praying for us. He is for us, even when we feel defeated by the wrong things in our lives.

Because Jesus is in heaven, the Ascension opens up the possibility that we can experience the life of heaven, both now and in eternity.

This year Ascension Day falls on Thursday May  $26^{th}$ . Do join us for a Deanery service at Beetham Church at  $7.30 \, \mathrm{pm}$

Mary then reintroduced Dinah Ball who had come to talk to us about dementia.



She said it is very important for sufferers to remain socially active for as long as possible and said that it is perfectly possible to live well if the right steps are taken.

As far as close friends and relatives are concerned Dinah said it is important to remember that if the sufferer becomes argumentative or even a little aggressive in conversation that it is the disease talking and not to correct but to go along with and agree in discussions.

Interestingly she said some of the treatment for aids has been found to have an amazing effect on dementia patients.

Dinah made what could have been a depressing talk into an exceptionally interesting and uplifting one and Jennie gave the vote of thanks. The meeting ended at 3-10pm.

So once more, Thank you, Colin. May you have many happy years of retirement.






## SAINT OF THE MONTH

In this regular feature we explore the lives of some less well-known saints whose feast day falls during the current month.

10th May - Comgall, the saint for those in education

Here is a great saint for all teachers, head teachers and principals of educational institutions, and indeed anyone whose vocation is to train and equip others.



If you have ever run an educational institution of 3,000 pupils (!), you will know it takes a special kind of person to cope with that, and Comgall seems to have been perfect for the job. A biographer at the time called him 'the outstanding father of the monks in Ireland, known for his insistence on study and strict discipline.'

Comgall's rule had what it took to succeed. It was 'strict, holy and constant', both 'graced with the hope of salvation and made perfect in love', according to the 7<sup>th</sup> century writer Antiphoner of Bangor. Above all, followers were to love Christ, and reject the love of money.

Comgall also had a gift for friendship, for on the death of a close friend, he wrote in grief: 'My soul-friend has died and I am headless; you too are headless, for a man without a soul-friend is a body without a head.'

Like heads and principals today, Comgall knew a lot of important people. He had trained Columbanus and knew Columba, whom he visited on Iona. They even preached the Gospel together in Inverness, to the pagan chieftain Brude.



#### Packed lunches

With food prices soaring, who needs a bought sandwich or salad? They can cost nearly £8 a day from LEON or Pret or other food outlets. Instead, it seems we are investing in plastic food containers (John Lewis reports sales are up 64 per cent on last year) and taking our own lunches to work.

As one cookery blogger explains, "You can't reduce your council tax, but you can make little savings on everyday meals, which add up to a significant difference."

"It's 'cool' these days to take a packed lunch to the office," says Suzanne Mulholland, author of The Batch Lady: Shop Once. Cook Once. Eat Well All Week. "Being organised and prepared is seen as a good thing."

As for coffee, consider this: buying a £3 cappuccino every day adds up to £1,095 a year. Far cheaper to fill a flask at home. 21
