# Letter from Rev Melanie Greenall, Minister at Sandylands and Stricklandgate Methodist Churches

### **Dear Friends**

Earlier this year, I had a week's holiday near Redditch. Not the most exciting of places (apologies if you're from the area) but I came across the hidden treasure of Coughton Court, the ancestral home of the Throckmorton family. I'd never heard of them before but it seems I should have as some were involved in the Gun Powder plot to kill the King which we remember every November 5<sup>th</sup>.

Why am I telling you this? Well, fast forward 400 years and in the hall now is a copy of the proclamation of the accession of King Charles III. Healing and reconciliation has been possible over time.

In these dark and dangerous times that is something we must cling to, that such is still possible.

We enter a season of remembrance with All Souls (giving thanks for all who have died) and continue on November 11<sup>th</sup> (and the nearest Sunday) to a national 2-minute silence as we reflect on two world wars and numerous conflicts, past and present.

We remember we say.

But to remember in the Biblical sense is more than simply recalling information. It is remembering the past in a way that affects us now, shapes us, but not necessarily binds us as we find the case in some many areas of conflict.

It is about recalling a God who promises to not forget us, no matter how much it can seem that way, but who also promises to remember us, to put us back together, make us whole once more. That is something our world is desperate for more than ever – to remember we are all made in God's image, we are all humans, deserving of dignity, of being treat well, with compassion.

40 years ago, Graham Kendrick wrote a plea for hope to be seen in place of despair.

Its sentiments seem doubly relevant today:

Beauty for brokenness, Hope for despair Lord, in the suffering this is our prayer

We can use our experiences to learn from past mistakes, to make different and better choices about the way we live and work and relate to others.

We can do something about creating the future we want it to be. Lets make it so.

Our Autumn programme commenced on the 27th of September .

All present were welcomed, including the speaker Rowena Pavey from South Lakes Carers, and two visitors Jane and Christine.

After the aims, purposes, and notices were read Elizabeth led the prayers.

This was followed by Rowena's presentation and film about the South Lakes Carers Service. The aim of the Carer service is about improving the lives of carers whatever their age. The main aim being to enable, support and advocate.

We were amazed by the number of unpaid carers who are usually family members of which 10% were under the age of 18yrs, looking after a family member with illness or a disability. Parent carers take total responsibility for an ill or disabled child.

# Some of the services offered by the service :

**Care :** They provide 1:1 confidential care and support either at home or at the carers hub.

**Counselling:** is provided in order to make things less overwhelming.

**Sitting Service:** This is to provide the carer a chance top have a break of up to three hours. This is provided by volunteers who are properly vetted. Carers can access this service for a maximum of 12 sittings a year.

There are volunteer telephone calls, support groups, and carer connect as additional part of the service provided.

Volunteers play a vital part of this service and volunteers find it very rewarding, an opportunity to meet others, attend social events and also share experiences.

Finally Jennie thanked Rowena for a most informative talk.

Members had brought with them articles for the Shoebox appeal which was given to Rowena, who had previously spoken to us about the Shoe box appeal.



# **Totters and Bumps and Babies**

## **Totters**

A very lively popular and friendly group which attracts between 40-50 toddlers plus adults every Monday 9 - 11am. It runs in term time only. The group is run primarily by a team of 5 volunteers. We provide support for the adults as well as activities for the children. Drinks for adults included in the fee. There are plenty of toys (large

and small), sit and ride toys, art and crafts, tuff tray messy activities, play dough, sand and sometimes a bouncy castle etc. We also have a quieter room for adults and children who find the other rooms too noisy and busy. The session ends with a healthy snack and a singing time.

# **Cornerstone Bumps and Babies (CBBs)**

This small and friendly group runs in term time only on a Monday afternoon from 1.30 - 3pm. It is run by 2 volunteers. We have between 6 - 14 babies from birth to 1 year old plus adults attend on a regular basis. We offer friendship, advice and support to the adults. This is a safe place to come and experience the highs and lows of being a new parent. We attract mums, couples, dads and grandparents (and particularly when mum returns to work) We have play mats, rugs etc for the tiny babies and good quality, safe and stimulating toys and a ball pool for the babies to play with as they begin to sit up, move and eventually walk. There is opportunity to weigh the babies as well. Included in the low price is a choice of hot and cold drinks and a selection of lovely homemade cakes or biscuits.

# Letter from Rev. Jean Radley Associate Priest – Beacon Team

## Dear Friends

November brings with it a host of memories. On November 1<sup>st</sup> we remember the Saints who have gone before us. On November 2<sup>nd</sup> we remember all those whom we have loved but see no more. We remember with gratitude those who gave their lives for the freedom of our country and also those who returned from the First and Second World Wars and subsequent conflicts with life-changing physical and mental scars on November 11<sup>th</sup> and Remembrance Sunday.

I have just read an amazing article which is to be found on the Church of Scotland's website of the reflections of a minister who, ten years ago, lost many members of his family during a double bomber suicide attack at All Saints Church in Peshawar, Pakistan. It's an amazing story of forgiveness, and I thought that you might be as moved as I am to read it.

A minister whose mother and 19 relatives were murdered by terrorists a decade ago has told how he has resisted feelings of revenge and hatred.

The Revd Aftab Gohar said he found peace through the teachings of Jesus Christ, following a double suicide bomber attack at All Saints Church in Peshawar, Pakistan on 22<sup>nd</sup> September, 2013. Worshippers had just left the building to join the fellowship meal on the lawn when two explosions ripped through the crowd, killing 122 people and injuring more than 250.

Among them was Mr Gohar's 79-year-old mother, his nieces, nephews, cousins, uncles, aunts and friends. The minister of Eddlestone, Peebles Old Parish, and Stobo and Drumelzier churches in the Scottish Borders, said they "died for their faith" and that surviving family members still miss them terribly.



Founded in 1947, Pakistan's constitution gives every citizen 'the right to profess, practice, and propagate his religion'. However, the official religion is Islam, and religious minorities are frequently attacked, with Pakistan's blasphemy laws being used to discriminate against non-Muslims. Mr Gohar believes that the controversial law is used to justify attacks, such as a recent spate of church and house burnings in Jaranwala near Faisalabad.

Early this autumn, he and other campaigners handed over a petition to Syed Zahid Raza, Consul General of Pakistan for Scotland and Northern Ireland, at the Consulate of Pakistan in Glasgow. It called on the government of Pakistan to improve safety for religious minorities and use the blasphemy law to punish those who desecrate Bibles and burn down churches and homes.

It was on 22<sup>nd</sup> September, 2013, when Mr Gohar was preparing to lead a church service, that he received a text message to say there had been a bombing in Pakistan and his mother and other relatives had died.

"It was hard for me to forgive those responsible, but with the strength of God I did so and freed myself from the extra burden of hatred and revenge. On the cross, Jesus prayed for those who were crucifying Him: 'Forgive them Father, they don't know what they are doing.' Jesus said 'Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you' – a lesson that some people find impossible to follow."

Mr Gohar was inspired by the words of Corrie Ten Boom, a Dutch watchmaker who helped Jewish people escape the Nazis during the Holocaust. "She said 'forgiveness is the key that unlocks the door of resentment and the handcuff of hatred,' added the minister. "It is a power that breaks chains of bitterness and the shackles of selfishness." Mr Gohar grew up in Peshawar and was ordained into the Church of Pakistan in 1995. After studying in Edinburgh he served at Abbotsgrange Parish Church in Grangemouth until his move to the Scottish Borders last year. Mr Gohar and his wife Samina and their two grown up sons, Shahan, and Zeeshan, are now British citizens.

The Church of Scotland has an official partnership with the Church of Pakistan, which is marking the 10th anniversary of the atrocity.

The rainfall in September 2023 was 208.1mm or 8.19 inches


The rainfall in September 2022 was 114.5mm or 4.15 inches

It consists of a large green box filled with a tent, blankets, mats, cooking utensils, mosquito nets, water filters etc.

It was started by the rotary Club of Helston Cornwall in the year 2000, they adopted it as their millennium project

They set up a warehouse, purchased the contents then packed the boxes in the warehouse.

In fact my husband along with other Rotarians from Cornwall would go down to Helston to help pack boxes.

Over the years the charity has grown. Its main headquarters are in Truro. Its patron is the Queen. She became its patron in 2007 when she was Duchess of Cornwall.


Through Rotary International, monies are donated from across the world. However half of all monies comes from the UK.
