#### <u>Letter from Rev Michelle Woodcock</u> Priest-in-Charge of the Beacon Team Churches

#### Dear Friends,

It always feels like something of a triumph to me to finally arrive in May. We've survived the cold and dark hours of the winter, trudged through the gloom and deprivation of Lent and are finally facing some days that promise lighter evenings and possibilities of sunshine and time to relax and play with family and friends.

For me, I guess that feeling is heightened by the sheer joy of getting up before the crack of dawn on May 1st and meeting a group of equally crazy friends on a local hill or mountain top and singing and Morris dancing as the sun rises. This moment is often full of pure joy. A simple celebration of being alive and appreciating the many gifts we have been given and the earth we share.

For me, it's a time when I thank God for friendship, for the gifts of music and dancing and for his wonderful creation. The others who share that special moment with me all have their own reasons for being there and together we are a very thankful and excited bunch despite the 4am wakeup call! This year we do this for the first time without one of our number who died last November. That moment will be tinged with sadness and grief as we remember our loss, but we will dance and sing harder to honour her memory.

I've been conscious a lot lately that 'in the midst of life we are in death' (Book of Common Prayer, funeral service) a phrase that acknowledges the inherent connection between life and death, reminding us that death is always a presence, even while we are living. It's been my privilege lately to conduct quite a few funerals and to walk with families as they grieve the loss of their loved ones. We've said goodbye to some huge characters around the Beacon Team in the last few months.

In this Easter season we can hold onto the hope that Jesus conquered even that ultimate finality of death by rising to new life and going ahead of us to prepare a place for us in heaven. The promise of the Christian faith is that through faith in Christ we will have the hope of heaven and a life beyond death.



We will be celebrating life in all its fulness and I will be giving thanks to God for the many blessings he has given me. #### **RISE UP against Domestic Abuse Campaign**

The Kendal with Grayrigg Mothers' Union has been awarded a Bronze Award, which we shall receive in June.

You may have wondered why in the Beacon Team Churches there are Teddy Bears, alongside a picture frame and message. Although simple, it is to make everyone aware of the MU campaign with information and contact details of how to access help. We have posters on the back of toilet doors with emergency numbers linking with national and local helplines.

Abuse, as we learnt in a recent talk by Claire (Springfield Support) is not always physical, but can be controlling and coercive behaviour. It can occur in any walk of life at all levels. So it is important to be aware that Domestic abuse happens. It is unlawful, hurtful, life limiting, cruel to entire families. There is a Women's and a recently opened Men's Refuge, to which through the Deanery MU we provide toiletry bags and personal hygiene items which members have collected.

It is important to remember in our prayers all victims and all who help them.

#### Kendal with Grayrigg Mothers' Union



Our March meeting began with prayers and the singing of the Mothers Union hymn, which includes the aims and purposes.

We welcomed Helen and Denise to talk and show us about 'Open the Book'. Helen asked where we had heard our first bible story – Mum or Dad's knee, grandparents, Sunday School or day school. She explained that sadly the majority of today's children are not hearing them at home, and there are two generations who do not know the Bible stories – the children & their parents. This prompted a group of Christians in Bedford in 1999, to explore the possibility of telling Bible stories in their local primary schools. As Christians we have God's story to tell and that is what *Open the Book* is all about, sharing God's story with the children of today in primary schools.

Using props, costumes, pictures etc to bring the stories to life, the group chose to use the Lion Story Teller Bible, written by Bob Hartman, as it starts at the beginning of creation and tells the main stories in chronological order. Helen said she thought the key word was *telling* a Bible story, not unpacking it afterwards, not preaching or evangelising, but simply sharing God's Word in an engaging, interesting way so that children of all faiths and those with none can watch and interact with the stories in their own way. Originally Helen helped promote and grow it across Derbyshire; then, in 2015, now living in Cumbria, Helen started a few groups in the Kendal area, Grayrigg, Natland, Selside and Burneside. There are now four teams of four volunteers (coming from different churches) visiting the schools each week. Children volunteer to take part, and love to dress up.

Helen, Denise, Karen and Rev Michelle acted for us the story of the Secret Baby. Although simple in its telling, it has the power to spark imagination, inspire exploration, give hope, create a smile, teach important lessons and connect generations. A huge Thank You to the actors for the drama and to Helen for her talk - a thoroughly enjoyable afternoon.

The above report is taken from Helen's notes, which she kindly agreed I could use.

Eileen Allen and I were warmly welcomed when we attended the delightful Lady Day Service at St Andrew's Coniston. Finally, thank you to all members who made posies for Mothering Sunday in our Churches.



#### **Totters and Bumps and Babies**

#### **Totters**

A very lively popular and friendly group which attracts between 40-50 toddlers plus adults every **Monday 9 - 11am**. It runs in *term time* only. The group is run primarily by a team of 5 volunteers. We provide support for the adults as well as activities for the children. Drinks for adults included in the fee. There are plenty of toys (large

and small), sit and ride toys, art and crafts, tuff tray messy activities, play dough, sand and sometimes a bouncy castle etc. We also have a quieter room for adults and children who find the other rooms too noisy and busy. The session ends with a healthy snack and a singing time.



#### **Cornerstone Bumps and Babies (CBBs)**

This small and friendly group runs in *term time only* on a Monday afternoon from 1.30 - 3pm. It is run by 2 volunteers. We have between 6 - 14 babies from birth to 1 year old plus adults attend on a regular basis. We offer friendship, advice and support to the adults. This is a safe place to come and experience the highs and lows of being a new parent. We attract mums, couples, dads and grandparents (particularly when mum returns to work). We have play mats, rugs etc for the tiny babies and good quality, safe and stimulating toys and a ball pool for the babies to play with as they begin to sit up, move and eventually walk. There is opportunity to weigh the babies as well. Included in the low price is a choice of hot and cold drinks and a selection of lovely homemade cakes or biscuits.






