Letter from Charles Cowling Ordinand in the Beacon Team

Dear Friends

I write this letter as we approach the end of 40 days celebrating Easter, the most momentous event the world has ever seen, when all our lives were changed forever, as the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead brought new hope to the world.

And I reflect on my personal momentous event in just over 40 days' time when I am to be ordained in Carlisle Cathedral on 1st July. It has been an amazing and wonderful journey for me. I have hugely enjoyed my time as part of the ministry team in the Beacon Mission Community. I have made very good friends and been moved and impressed by the strength of the Christian community in and around Kendal. I have also enjoyed being heavily involved in the wonderful organisation which is Manna House, based within our community and a shining light for the Christian imperative to love one another and provide caring support for the more vulnerable members of our society. Additionally, I have been privileged to participate in the ministry in our inspiring church schools in Burneside, Grayrigg and Selside. I have also had the opportunity to join uplifting Christian mission in action at the impressive restorative justice programme in Lancaster Farms Prison.

But I have also seen some of the challenges of developing ministry and community in our rural churches and ageing populations. We have wonderful churches and communities in Burneside, Grayrigg, Longsleddale, Selside, Skelsmergh, and St George's and I have so enjoyed being part of all these families. But increasingly, if we are going to see our Mission Community thrive, I believe it is going to require us to do more together as one big family, working together and supporting each other.

On the first Sunday in May (the 5th Sunday after Easter) I was delighted to be leading the service at Skelsmergh as we all celebrated the coronation of King Charles III.

When I looked back through my notes I was surprised to see that two years ago I was also leading the service (with Jean) at Skelsmergh on Easter 5. I particularly remember that service because Jean produced some lovely bookmarks based on John 15:5 "I am the true vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit", and that bookmark stays in the book by my bed. So I often reflect on that particular verse from John 15.

It seems particularly appropriate to me as I approach ordination and think what it means to be a small branch trying to be bear the fruit of Christ. But of course that verse applies to us all. We can all be branches of the true vine, by being witnesses to our faith and sharing that faith with others. And when a recent (Talking Jesus) report from the Church of England highlights how Christians are viewed positively by others and how so many people come to faith simply through a conversation with a Christian then there is a responsibility on all of us to share our faith with all those around us.

As I look forward to taking up my curacy in the Upper Eden and Westmorland Dales Benefice, I look back with huge fondness on my time in the Beacon Team. I will miss you all but I will be back to visit. Finally a big thank you to Tricia, Jean and Sue for their loving help and support and to you all for your encouragement. I so appreciate all your kindness.
