

# From the Priest in Charge

Dear Friends

What does Easter mean to you?

In thinking about the answer to that question I went to 'Google images' and put in the word "Easter". My computer screen was filled with brightly coloured decorated eggs, chocolate eggs, rabbits (cartoon and real), yellow fluffy chicks, bunches of tulips and daffodils. Only 10 images out of over 400 had any overtly Christian content. I began to wonder if the 400 pictures were a sort of snapshot of how people perceive Easter - as just a welcome Bank Holiday with extra chocolate. Because if that is so, people are really missing out on something important.



For me Easter is about new starts, new life, new birth, new hope. We give and receive Easter eggs and maybe cards with pictures of spring sunshine or new-born chicks. But Easter isn't really about eggs or chicks. It's about Jesus! The real reason that we think about new life at Easter is because Jesus, who was crucified on that first Good Friday, rose to new life on the first Easter Sunday.

This is not just a wonderful story, it's an historical fact. Jesus' body was never found and his resurrection never disproved. This was despite the best efforts of the mighty Roman Empire and the committed and powerful Jewish leaders to destroy the early church and discredit their belief. The early disciples were changed from a frightened and disillusioned group of people to those who stood up against the authorities and eventually gave their lives for what they believed- for what they knew to be true - that Jesus came back to life on Easter Sunday. New life for Jesus, leading to new life in his disciples.

The impact of what happened that first Easter is still relevant today. In the willing death of Jesus, God found a way to make our forgiveness

His gift, while showing, that wrongdoing and falling short of his best intentions for us are still serious matters. As the Son of God, Jesus overcame death; he rose from death, never to die again.

When Jesus died and rose, he did it for us and all people. He offers us new life, eternal life, with him; life that starts now, but continues beyond this life. Now that is worth celebrating!

I hope you have a wonderful Easter. I hope you get to eat some Easter eggs - but not too many! I hope you enjoy a break from work and some quality time with family and friends. But more than all of this, I hope you spend some time thinking about the real meaning of Easter, Jesus' resurrection. I hope you spend some time thinking about the possibilities of a new life for yourself, starting now and continuing into eternity.

We have services on Good Friday (15<sup>th</sup>) Holy Saturday evening (16<sup>th</sup>) and Easter Day (17<sup>th</sup>), Please do come and join with us, to celebrate and learn more about what Jesus has done for us.

## ***Ukraine***

### **Attack on Ukraine 'an act of great evil' - statement from Archbishops of Canterbury and York**



The Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby and Archbishop of York Stephen Cottrell have condemned the Russian attack on Ukraine as "an act of great evil". They are urging Christians to keep praying for Ukraine, for Russia, and for peace.

In a joint statement they said: "The horrific and unprovoked attack on Ukraine is an act of great evil. Placing our trust in Jesus Christ, the author of peace, we pray for an urgent ceasefire and a withdrawal of Russian forces. We call for a public decision to choose the way of peace and an international conference to secure long term agreements for stability and lasting peace."

***The Bishop in Europe, Bishop Robert Innes, writes:***

"Our little church in Kyiv are right at the centre of this crisis," he explained. "Some of them have fled the city by car, others are still there. These are our people, our brothers and sisters, and of course we are very concerned for their wellbeing and safety.

"In the face of military action and aggression, we feel powerless. What can we do? One thing that we can all do is pray."

"The situation in Ukraine is very deeply troubling. President Putin is leading a completely unjustified and aggressive war against Ukraine, a war which many ordinary Russians deeply deplore.

Leaders from many Christian churches, including the Ukrainian Orthodox (Russian Patriarchate) Church have condemned the invasion of Ukraine. Our hearts cry out for justice and peace. We are most especially concerned for the wellbeing of those in Ukraine who are directly affected by the war.

This includes particularly the members of our own congregation of Christ Church, Kyiv. The Churchwarden there, Christina, messaged us this morning saying: 'Please pray for us as we are standing here for our land and for our roots. The battle for Kyiv has begun; it is fierce and intensive. Pray for us.'

In the face of military action, we can easily feel powerless and fearful. But one thing we can do is pray. We can pray in solidarity with those most affected. We can pray that God will yet overrule in the hearts and minds of those with power and authority. We can pray that the victims will be few and that the innocent will be protected. We can pray that peace will come through justice and not through the infliction of the will of a stronger party on a weaker.

On Maundy Thursday we are having what I think will be our first Agape Meal in the Beacon Team and because this will be new to most people let me provide some brief details for the event.

The agape (pronounced a-gah-pay, from the Greek meaning love) is one of the most ancient traditions in Christianity, stretching back to the period of the early church community when there was no institutional church. Instead, Christians would gather at someone's home and celebrate their faith through a communal meal that commemorated both the Last Supper and the fellowship of their faith community. It is a time for sharing nourishment of food for the body and a time for thanking God.

With the Agape Meal, the Eucharist returns to the dining table where it began and becomes a remembering and community-building meal. Bread and wine are shared in a simple way at the end of the meal with prayers and a hymn.

Everyone is welcome but please do sign up on one of the sheets in any of our Churches or the one in Grayrigg Hall. We need to know so that we can cook enough food. Also of any intolerances you have.

Alternatively please join us at St George's for a Maundy Thursday Communion and vigil.


It can be read in the Bible in

Very early Sunday morning, some of Jesus' friends went to put spices on his body.




They saw the tomb was empty and only the cloths that Jesus' body had been wrapped in lying there. So they went back to the others.



## The last Passover

On the night before He died, Jesus ate His last Passover meal with His disciples. He then transformed the Passover into the Lord's Supper, saying of the bread and wine that, 'this is my body' and 'this is my blood'. Jesus, the Lamb of God, was preparing to die for the sins of the whole world. John's gospel makes it clear that the Last Supper took place the evening BEFORE the regular Passover meal, and that later Jesus died at the same time that the Passover lambs were killed.

Jesus then astonished the disciples by washing their feet. He said: "A new command I give you: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." His disciples were to love through service, not domination, of one another. In Latin, the opening phrase of this sentence is 'mandatum novum do vobis'. The word 'maundy' is thus a corruption of the Latin 'mandatum' (or command).

## SAINT OF THE MONTH

*In this regular feature we explore the lives of some less well-known saints whose feast day falls during the current month.*

**12<sup>th</sup> April: Zeno of Verona, the more things change...**

Zeno of Verona (d. 371) should be the patron saint of all ministers who suspect that the more things change, the more they remain the same.



For instance: ethnic diversity...church-planting... teaching.... concern for the poor... women's ministry in the church... sound like modern-day Christian concerns? Not a bit of it - this was the life work of Zeno, bishop of Verona in the fourth century.

Ethnic diversity? Zeno was an African who had been consecrated a bishop in Italian Verona. Church-planting and teaching? Zeno had a reputation as a hard-working pastor and dedicated preacher who founded churches throughout his domain. Some of his sermons still survive.

Concern for the poor? Zeno was zealous in alms-giving, and encouraged others to do the same. Women's ministry? He founded nunneries and encouraged virgins living at home to be consecrated long before ever Ambrose did the same in Milan.

As for down-time? Zeno may well have been addicted to fishing in his spare time - he is, after all, usually represented with a fish. Nothing wrong with that: the links between fishermen and Christian leaders go back a long way!


